This notice may be supplemented with any new significant facts learned subsequent to its submission. By providing this notice, AttainX does not waive any rights or defenses regarding the applicability of Nebraska law, the applicability of the Nebraska data event notification statute, or personal jurisdiction.

Nature of the Data Event

On May 15, 2025, AttainX learned of suspicious activity relating to certain computer systems within its network. In response, AttainX promptly took steps to secure its network and initiated a comprehensive investigation to determine the full nature and scope of the activity with the assistance of third-party forensic specialists. The investigation determined that between April 13, 2025, and May 15, 2025, certain files within AttainX's network were accessed and downloaded without authorization. AttainX identified the affected files and completed a time-intensive and comprehensive review of the files to identify personal information contained therein, the individuals to whom it relates, and address information to be used for notifying the impacted individuals. AttainX recently completed this review and worked diligently to issue notification as expeditiously as possible.

The universe of information that may have been affected in the event includes name, Social Security number, driver's license number, passport number, and/or financial account information.

Notice to Nebraska Resident

On September 30, 2025, AttainX began providing written notice of this incident to approximately one (1) Nebraska resident. Written notice is being provided in substantially the same form as the letter attached here as ***Exhibit A***.

Other Steps Taken and To Be Taken

Upon learning of the event, AttainX moved quickly to investigate and respond to the incident, assess the security of AttainX systems, and identify potentially affected individuals. AttainX is also working to implement additional safeguards and training to its employees. AttainX is providing access to credit monitoring services for one (1) year through TransUnion to individuals whose personal information was potentially affected by this incident, at no cost to these individuals.

Additionally, AttainX is providing impacted individuals with guidance on how to better protect against identity theft and fraud, including advising individuals to report any suspected incidents of identity theft or fraud to their credit card company and/or bank. AttainX is providing individuals with information on how to place a fraud alert and security freeze on one's credit file, the contact details for the national consumer reporting agencies, information on how to obtain a free credit report, a reminder to remain vigilant for incidents of fraud and identity theft by reviewing account statements and monitoring free credit reports, and encouragement to contact the Federal Trade Commission, their state Attorney General, and law enforcement to report attempted or actual identity theft and fraud.

AttainX is providing written notice of this incident to relevant state regulators, as necessary, and to the three major credit reporting agencies, Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion.

NOTICE OF SECURITY INCIDENT

Dear _____ :

AttainX, Inc. is writing to inform you of an event that impacted the privacy of some of your personal information. Although at this time there is no indication that your information has been used to commit identity theft or fraud in relation to this event, we are providing you with information about the event, our response, and additional measures you can take to help protect your information, should you feel it appropriate to do so.

What Happened? On May 15, 2025, AttainX learned of suspicious activity relating to certain computer systems within our network. In response, we promptly took steps to secure our network and initiated a comprehensive investigation to determine the full nature and scope of the activity with the assistance of third-party forensic specialists. The investigation determined that between April 13, 2025, and May 15, 2025, certain files within AttainX's network were accessed and downloaded without authorization. AttainX identified the affected files and completed a time-intensive and comprehensive review of the files to identify personal information contained therein, the individuals to whom it relates, and address information to be used for notifying the impacted individuals. That process was recently completed and we are notifying you because the investigation determined certain information related to you was contained within the affected files.

What Information Was Involved? The review determined the following types of information related to you may have been present in the affected files at the time of the event: your name, Social Security number, driver's license number, passport number, and financial account information.

What We Are Doing. The confidentiality, privacy, and security of personal information within our care are among AttainX's highest priorities. Upon learning of the event, we promptly commenced an investigation and response that included confirming the security of our systems, investigating to determine the information that was impacted, and reviewing the contents of relevant data for personal information. As part of our ongoing commitment to the privacy of information in our care, we implemented additional security measures to further protect against similar incidents occurring in the future.

As an added precaution, we are offering you access to Single Bureau Credit Monitoring/Single Bureau Credit Report/Single Bureau Credit Score services at no charge. These services provide you with alerts for twelve (12) months from the date of enrollment when changes occur to your credit file. This notification is sent to you the same day that the change or update takes place with the bureau. Finally, we are providing you proactive fraud assistance to help with any questions that you might have or in event that you become a

victim of fraud. These services will be provided by Cyberscout, a TransUnion company specializing in fraud assistance and remediation services. Please note that you will not be automatically enrolled in these services. Should you wish to do so, you will need to enroll yourself in these services, as we are not able to do so on your behalf. You may find instructions on how to enroll in these services in the enclosed *Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Personal Information*.

What You Can Do. We encourage you to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud by reviewing your account statements and monitoring your free credit reports for suspicious activity and to detect errors for the twelve (12) months. Please also review the enclosed *Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Personal Information*, which contains information on what you can do to safeguard against possible misuse of your information should you feel it is appropriate to do so. You may also enroll in the complimentary credit monitoring services we are making available to you, free of cost.

Steps You Can Take To Help Protect Personal Information

Enroll in Monitoring Services

To enroll in Credit Monitoring services at no charge, please log on to <https://bfs.cyberscout.com/activate> and follow the instructions provided. When prompted please provide the following unique code to receive services:

In order for you to receive the monitoring services described above, you must enroll within 90 days from the date of this letter. The enrollment requires an internet connection and e-mail account and may not be available to minors under the age of 18 years of age. Please note that when signing up for monitoring services, you may be asked to verify personal information for your own protection to confirm your identity.

Monitor Your Accounts

Under U.S. law, a consumer is entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus, Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion. To order a free credit report, visit www.annualcreditreport.com or call, toll-free, 1-877-322-8228. Consumers may also directly contact the three major credit reporting bureaus listed below to request a free copy of their credit report.

Consumers have the right to place an initial or extended “fraud alert” on a credit file at no cost. An initial fraud alert is a 1-year alert that is placed on a consumer’s credit file. Upon seeing a fraud alert display on a consumer’s credit file, a business is required to take steps to verify the consumer’s identity before extending new credit. If consumers are the victim of identity theft, they are entitled to an extended fraud alert, which is a fraud alert lasting seven years. Should consumers wish to place a fraud alert, please contact any of the three major credit reporting bureaus listed below.

As an alternative to a fraud alert, consumers have the right to place a “credit freeze” on a credit report, which will prohibit a credit bureau from releasing information in the credit report without the consumer’s express authorization. The credit freeze is designed to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in a consumer’s name without consent. However, consumers should be aware that using a credit freeze to take control over who gets access to the personal and financial information in their credit report may delay, interfere with, or prohibit the timely approval of any subsequent request or application they make regarding a new loan, credit, mortgage, or any other account involving the extension of credit. Pursuant to federal law, consumers cannot be charged to place or lift a credit freeze on their credit report. To request a credit freeze, individuals may need to provide some or all of the following information:

1. Full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., II, III, etc.);
2. Social Security number;
3. Date of birth;
4. Addresses for the prior two to five years;
5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility bill or telephone bill;
6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (state driver’s license or ID card, etc.); and
7. A copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft if they are a victim of identity theft.

Additional Information

Consumers may further educate themselves regarding identity theft, fraud alerts, credit freezes, and the steps they can take to protect your personal information by contacting the consumer reporting bureaus, the Federal Trade Commission, or their state Attorney General. Please note that in order to file a report with law enforcement for identity theft, consumers will likely need to provide some proof that they have been a victim. Further, pursuant to the Fair Credit Reporting Act, the consumer reporting bureaus must correct or delete inaccurate, incomplete, or unverifiable information; consumer reporting agencies may not report outdated negative information; access to consumers' files is limited; consumers must give consent for credit reports to be provided to employers; consumers may limit "prescreened" offers of credit and insurance based on information in their credit report; and consumers may seek damages from violators.
