We represent Huntingdon Special School District (“HSSD”), located at 585 High Street, P.O. Box 648, Huntingdon, TN 38344, and are writing to notify your office of an event involving certain personal information relating to approximately one (1) Nebraska resident. By providing this notice, HSSD does not waive any rights or defenses regarding the applicability of Nebraska law, the applicability of the Nebraska data event notification statute, or personal jurisdiction.

Nature of the Data Event

On or around January 16, 2025, PowerSchool, a software provider used by many schools around the country, notified HSSD that they experienced a security event which impacted data hosted on their systems. This event did not impact HSSD’s systems. PowerSchool informed HSSD that between December 19, 2024 and December 28, 2024, certain data was accessed and downloaded by an unknown actor. In the absence of specific information from PowerSchool regarding the identities of affected individuals or the specific types of personal information at issue for those individuals, HSSD reviewed the data processed by PowerSchool to determine what personal information was affected.

Through this review, HSSD determined that the affected personal information may include certain individuals’ names and Social Security numbers.

Notice to Nebraska Resident

We understand that PowerSchool may have provided emailed notice to certain affected individuals in late January 2025. However, without the ability to confirm the final content or recipients of these notifications, HSSD provided written notice of this event to approximately one (1) Nebraska resident on or about March 11, 2025. Written notice is being provided in substantially the same form as the letter attached here as ***Exhibit A***. HSSD also provided notice of this event on its website.

Other Steps Taken and To Be Taken

Upon discovering the event, HSSD confirmed the security of its data hosted by PowerSchool, initiated an investigation, and reviewed the information provided by PowerSchool to identify any individuals whose personal information may have been affected. Through PowerSchool, HSSD is providing individuals whose personal information was involved in this event with access to credit monitoring services for two (2) years through Experian at no cost to the individuals.

Additionally, HSSD is providing impacted individuals with guidance on how to better protect against identity theft and fraud. HSSD is providing individuals with information on how to place a fraud alert and security freeze on one’s credit file, the contact details for the national consumer reporting agencies, information on how to obtain a free credit report, a reminder to remain vigilant for incidents of fraud and identity theft by reviewing account statements and monitoring free credit reports, and encouragement to contact the Federal Trade Commission, their state Attorney General, and law enforcement to report attempted or actual identity theft and fraud.

HSSD is also providing written notice of this event to relevant state regulators, as necessary, and the three major consumer credit reporting agencies.

NOTICE OF SECURITY INCIDENT

PowerSchool, a software provider used by many schools around the country, including Huntingdon Special School District (“HSSD”), notified us that they experienced a security event which impacted data hosted on their systems. Based on the information provided to date by PowerSchool, HSSD understands that the affected data may involve your personal information. This event did not impact HSSD’s systems. HSSD is providing you with information about PowerSchool’s event, HSSD’S response, and resources available to you to help protect your information, should you feel it appropriate to do so. You may also have received a separate email communication from PowerSchool concerning this event.

What Happened? PowerSchool informed HSSD that, between December 19, 2024 and December 28, 2024, certain data was accessed and downloaded by an unknown actor. Through our investigation, and based on the information provided by PowerSchool, HSSD understands that information related to you was involved in this event.

What Information Was Involved? The personal information involved includes your name and Social Security number.

What We Are Doing. Upon becoming aware of this event, HSSD initiated an investigation, and reviewed the information provided by PowerSchool to identify any individuals whose personal information may have been affected. As part of our ongoing commitment to the privacy of information in our care, HSSD is reviewing its policies and procedures to further protect against similar events occurring in the future.

As an added precaution, PowerSchool is offering you identity theft protection services for twenty-four (24) months through Experian at no cost to you. Please note that you will not be automatically enrolled in these services. HSSD encourages you to enroll in these services as we are not able to do so on your behalf. You can find information on how to enroll in these services in the enclosed *Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Your Personal Information*.

What You Can Do. HSSD encourages you to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud by reviewing your account statements and monitoring your free credit reports for suspicious activity and to detect errors. You may also enroll in the complimentary credit monitoring and identity theft protection services PowerSchool is offering. You may also review the information contained in the enclosed *Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Your Personal Information*.

Enroll in Monitoring Services

PowerSchool is offering two (2) years of complimentary identity protection services to individuals whose information was involved. For adult students and educators, this offer will also include two (2) years of complimentary credit monitoring.

Monitor Your Accounts

Under U.S. law, a consumer is entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus, Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion. To order a free credit report, visit www.annualcreditreport.com or call, toll-free, 1-877-322-8228. Consumers may also directly contact the three major credit reporting bureaus listed below to request a free copy of their credit report.

Consumers have the right to place an initial or extended "fraud alert" on a credit file at no cost. An initial fraud alert is a 1-year alert that is placed on a consumer's credit file. Upon seeing a fraud alert display on a consumer's credit file, a business is required to take steps to verify the consumer's identity before extending new credit. If consumers are the victim of identity theft, they are entitled to an extended fraud alert, which is a fraud alert lasting seven years. Should consumers wish to place a fraud alert, please contact any of the three major credit reporting bureaus listed below.

As an alternative to a fraud alert, consumers have the right to place a "credit freeze" on a credit report, which will prohibit a credit bureau from releasing information in the credit report without the consumer's express authorization. The credit freeze is designed to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in a consumer's name without consent. However, consumers should be aware that using a credit freeze to take control over who gets access to the personal and financial information in their credit report may delay, interfere with, or prohibit the timely approval of any subsequent request or application they make regarding a new loan, credit, mortgage, or any other account involving the extension of credit. Pursuant to federal law, consumers cannot be charged to place or lift a credit freeze on their credit report. To

request a credit freeze, individuals may need to provide some or all of the following information:

1. Full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., II, III, etc.);
2. Social Security number;
3. Date of birth;
4. Addresses for the prior two to five years;
5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility bill or telephone bill;
6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (state driver's license or ID card, etc.); and
7. A copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft if they are a victim of identity theft.

Additional Information

Consumers may further educate themselves regarding identity theft, fraud alerts, credit freezes, and the steps they can take to protect your personal information by contacting the consumer reporting bureaus, the Federal Trade Commission, or their state Attorney General. The Federal Trade Commission also encourages those who discover that their information has been misused to file a complaint with them. Please note that in order to file a report with law enforcement for identity theft, consumers will likely need to provide some proof that they have been a victim. Instances of known or suspected identity theft should also be reported to law enforcement and the relevant state Attorney General. This notice has not been delayed by law enforcement.

Further, pursuant to the Fair Credit Reporting Act, the consumer reporting bureaus must correct or delete inaccurate, incomplete, or unverifiable information; consumer reporting agencies may not report outdated negative information; access to consumers' files is limited; consumers must give consent for credit reports to be provided to employers; consumers may limit "prescreened" offers of credit and insurance based on information in their credit report; and consumers may seek damages from violators. Consumers may have additional rights under the Fair Credit Reporting Act not summarized here. Identity theft victims and active-duty military personnel have specific additional rights pursuant to the Fair Credit Reporting Act.
