Dear Attorney General Mike Hilgers:

We represent DiClemente Siegel Design Inc. (“DiClemente”), an engineering and architecture firm headquartered in Southfield, Michigan. We write in accordance with the Nebraska Financial Data Protection and Consumer Notification of Data Security Breach Act of 2006, NEB. REV. STAT. § 87-803 (2016), to report a data event that impacted the personal information of one (1) resident of Nebraska. In making this submission, DiClemente does not waive its rights or defenses regarding the applicability of Nebraska law or personal jurisdiction.

On November 13, 2025, DiClemente became aware of suspicious activity within its network environment, which was later confirmed to be ransomware, and took immediate action to secure the environment. DiClemente engaged our law firm, and we retained CFC Security, Inc. d/b/a/ CFC Response, a cyber forensics specialist firm, to conduct an investigation into the cause and scope of the incident. Following the investigation, DiClemente learned that an unknown party accessed and acquired data from its network on November 7, 2025 - November 13, 2025. On January 15, 2026 DiClemente confirmed that certain files within that data set contained personal information. On February 13, 2026, after a national-change-of-address (NCOA) search was run by a notification vendor to verify contact information for those persons whose data was involved, DiClemente learned that one (1) Nebraska resident’s personal information was involved.

DiClemente notified one (1) Nebraska resident via U.S. mail on February 20, 2026. The impacted data included individual’s name and Social Security number. Notified individuals were offered an opportunity to enroll in 12 months of complimentary credit monitoring and identity protection services through Kroll. A sample copy of the notification letter is enclosed.

DiClemente has taken steps in response to the incident to help mitigate the risk of a similar incident occurring in the future, including reviewing its existing security policies and protections and adopting additional security to safeguard against evolving threats moving

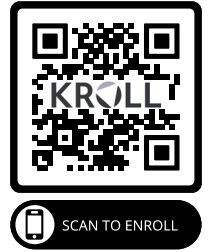

DiClemente Siegel Design Inc. takes privacy and security very seriously. As part of that commitment, we write to notify you of a data privacy incident involving your personal information. This notice explains the incident, our response, and steps one may take for added protection of personal information, if desired. We are also offering the opportunity to enroll in complimentary identity monitoring services.

What Happened: On November 13, 2025, we discovered suspicious activity within our network environment. Upon discovery, we took immediate action to secure our network environment, which included taking parts of our network offline, and retained cybersecurity professionals to investigate. As part of the investigation, we learned that some data from our network was accessed and acquired by an unauthorized actor on November 7, 2025 – November 13, 2025. We then underwent a comprehensive data review to determine what information was involved and to whom that information belonged. As a result of this investigation, on January 15, 2025, we determined that your personal information was included in the data set.

What Information Was Involved: Our review of the files determined your first and last name in combination with your Social Security number were in the data set.

What We Are Doing: We are reviewing and updating our existing security policies and protections already in place on our network. We also implemented additional security to safeguard against evolving threats moving forward. As added protection, we are offering <<ServiceTerminMonths>> months of complimentary identity monitoring services through Kroll. Instructions for how to enroll in these services are enclosed.

What You Can Do: As a general matter, it is good practice to remain vigilant for incidents of identity theft and fraud, from any source, by reviewing your credit reports and account statements for suspicious activity and errors. If you discover any suspicious or unusual activity on your accounts, promptly contact your financial institution or service provider. Please refer to the enclosed “*Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Your Information*” for additional resources you may take advantage of to protect against fraud and identity theft, should you find it appropriate to do so.

Monitor Your Accounts and Credit Reports: It is good practice to remain vigilant of incidents of identity theft and fraud by reviewing your credit reports/account statements and explanation of benefits forms for suspicious activity and to detect errors. Under U.S. law, you are entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus, TransUnion, Experian, and Equifax. To order your free credit report, visit www.annualcreditreport.com or call 1-877-322-8228. Once you receive your credit report, review it for discrepancies and identify any accounts you did not open or inquiries from creditors that you did not authorize. If you have questions or notice incorrect information, contact the credit reporting bureau.

Fraud Alert Services: You have the right to place an initial or extended “fraud alert” on a credit file at no cost. An initial fraud alert is a one-year alert that is placed on a consumer’s credit file. Upon seeing a fraud alert, a business is required to take steps to verify the consumer’s identity before extending new credit. If you are a victim of identity theft, you are entitled to an extended fraud alert lasting seven years. Should you wish to place a fraud alert, please contact any of the three credit reporting bureaus listed below.

Credit Freeze Instructions: As an alternative to a fraud alert, you have the right to place a “credit freeze” on a credit report, which will prohibit a credit bureau from releasing information in the credit report without your express authorization. The credit freeze is designed to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in your name without your consent. However, you should be aware that using a credit freeze may delay, interfere with, or prohibit the timely approval of any subsequent request or application you make regarding a new loan, credit, mortgage, or any other account involving the extension of credit.

Pursuant to federal law, you cannot be charged to place or lift a credit freeze on your credit report. To request a credit freeze, you should provide the following information:

- 1. Full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., III, etc.);
- 2. Social Security number;
- 3. Date of birth;
- 4. Address for the prior two to five years;
- 5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility or telephone bill;
- 6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (e.g., state driver’s license or identification card); and
- 7. A copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft, if you are a victim of identity theft.
